## 1. Glossary of Common Terms used in these Regulations

A **Programme**" refers to *the <u>general type of course</u> that students follow*. These regulations cover the following programme: *Postgraduate Certificate of Education [PGCE]*.

- A "Level" gives a <u>broad indication of how complex and challenging a course</u>
   <u>is designed to be</u>, defined in relation to the national Higher Education Credit
   Framework.
  - The programme covered by these regulations is aimed at *Masters Level*, which
    can be referred to as either Level M or [where it is desirable to indicate a link to
    the national framework] Level M[7].
  - Notwithstanding the intended level of the programme, students who fail to satisfy the examiners at that Level may, depending upon their performance, be granted an award at Honours Level, the most advanced level associated with undergraduate Bachelors degrees, which can be referred to as either Level H or [where it is desirable to indicate a link to the national framework] Level H[6].

- A "Route" refers to the subject taken by a student.
- An Award" refers to the type of certification students receive on completion of their course

## 2 **General Regulatory Framework**

## 2.1 **Awarding Body**

All students shall be registered to study for awards of Liverpool Hope University.

#### 2.2 Overarching Regulations

In addition to these programme regulations awards will be subject to

- Liverpool Hope University's Universal Assessment Regulations.
- Liverpool Hope University's Universal Conventions and Procedures.

#### 2.3 Changes to the Programmes

Proposals to change or remove elements of the programmes, and proposals to introduce new elements to the programmes, shall be submitted for formal approval in accordance with the guidance published annually by the University.

## 3. Cohorts covered by the Regulations

These Regulations will apply to all students from 2023/4 entrants onwards.

## 4. Eligibility for Registration

- **4.1** In order to enter the programme, students must normally possess the entry requirements for postgraduate Teacher Training in England.
- **4.2** In addition to the requirements in paragraph 4.1, all applicants must satisfy the following criteria for selection for a face-to-face interview:
  - [a] commitment to teaching as a career;
  - [b] awareness of areas affecting children's learning;
  - [c] awareness of the skills they will need to develop to become effective teachers;
  - [d] awareness of current issues in education;
  - [e] good interpersonal skills:
  - [f] confidence and independence;
  - [g] good communication skills (oral and written);
  - [h] the ability and personal resources to manage their own learning in consultation with a designated partner representative:
  - [i] enthusiasm, and commitment.
  - [j] successfully complete a fundamental skills test in literacy (and in mathematics for PGCE Primary applicants)
- **4.3** In addition, applicants for the PGCE Secondary will also demonstrate:
  - [a] an appropriate level of subject knowledge

- **4.4** In addition to the requirements in clause 4.1, 4.2 and 4.3 candidates shall be interviewed by a designated partner representative such as a head teacher from a partner school, in order to demonstrate:
  - [a] an awareness of the demands of the profession;
  - [b] willingness and ability to evaluate honestly their own strengths and weaknesses.
  - [c] an awareness of, and ability to discuss, an area of current educational interest.
  - [d] presentation skills, correct use of standard English and the ability to contribute to a discussion.

## 5. Structure of the Programme

- **5.1** The PGCE is a linear and sequenced course with generic elements and specific elements related to the specialist subject identified by the student's route.
- **5.2** The PGCE programme design will adhere to the minimum time allocation of 36 weeks (180 days).
- 5.3 Students are required to engage with taught content and with a minimum of 120 days school- based practice in a minimum of two schools. An additional intensive training and practice element of 4 weeks (20 days) is also compulsory across the training year.

## 6. <u>Duration of the Programme</u>

#### All durations are determined according to the date of registration.

#### **Full Time**

#### 6.1 Normal Duration

Students shall normally complete the course in one academic year.

#### 6.2 Extended Duration as a result of Reassessments and/or Interruptions

Students who are required to undertake reassessments or are allowed to interrupt their studies, will be expected to complete their studies in two academic years.

## 6.3 Further Extended Duration as a result of Mitigating Circumstances

The Continuation and Award Board for PGCE can grant a student an extension of up to one academic year beyond the maximum duration listed in paragraph 6.2 if appropriate evidence is provided.

## 6.4 <u>Further Extended Duration granted by Senate as a result of Very Exceptional Mitigating Circumstances</u>

A further extension can be granted by the Chair of Senate in the most exceptional circumstances. This cannot extend the students studies beyond 4 academic years.

## **Part Time**

## 6.5 Normal Duration

Students shall normally complete the course in two academic years.

## 6.6 Extended Duration as a result of Reassessments and/or Interruptions

Students who are required to undertake reassessments or are allowed to interrupt their studies, will be expected to complete their studies in four academic years.

### 6.7 Further Extended Duration as a result of Mitigating Circumstances

The Continuation and Award Board for PGCE can grant a student an extension of up to one academic year beyond the maximum duration listed in paragraph 6.2 if appropriate evidence is provided.

## 6.8 <u>Further Extended Duration granted by Senate as a result of Very Exceptional Mitigating Circumstances</u>

A further extension can be granted by the Chair of Senate in the most exceptional circumstances. This cannot extend the students studies beyond 6 academic years.

## 7. <u>Assessment Regulations</u>

## 7.1 General

Except as indicated in paragraphs 7.2 & 7.3 below, assessment shall be conducted in accordance with the University's *Universal Assessment Regulations*.

## 7.2 Types of Assessment

## Academic Assessments

 Students shall be required to successfully complete academic assessments approved for the programme.

#### 7.3 Marking Schemes

Academic Assessments are marked against the masters element of the University marking scales with the addition of Honours level passes detailed in Clause 8.3 of these programme regulations.

#### 8. Completion and Awards

## 8.1 Completion

8.1.1 Students will be deemed to have completed their course, and become eligible for the award of a Postgraduate Certificate in Education when they have successfully completed academic assessments.

Note: Judgements about successful completion of Professional Standards, and therefore recommendation for Qualified Teacher Status, will be made by the Provider.

## 8.2 Eligibility for the Award of a Postgraduate Certificate

All students must meet the following base line criteria to be awarded a *Postgraduate* Certificate:

- [a] Achieved an overall pass for all modules.
- [b] No individual assessment outcome lower than F+ against Level 7 criteria.
- [c] No outcome associated with non-submission including marks of 0 for academic misconduct, late submission etc.

The PGCE at Liverpool Hope can be awarded at Pass, Merit and Distinction standard as

## follows:

- [a] Distinction: awarded to a student with a rounded award mark of 70, or a rounded aggregate of 68-69 with 50% of the assessment outcomes in the higher band; [b] Merit: Awarded to a student with a rounded award mark of 60, or a rounded aggregate of 58-59 with 50% of the assessment outcomes in the higher band;
- [c] Pass: Awarded to a student with a rounded award mark of 50.

## 8.1.2 The *award* shall be styled:

Postgraduate Certificate in Education [Designation], with [Distinction or Merit where appropriate].

Liverpool Hope does not make recommendations for QTS.

## 8.3 Eligibility for the Award of a Professional Graduate Certificate (PgCE)

- [a] Students who do not meet the academic criteria for the postgraduate certificate will be awarded a *PgCE* the following criteria are satisfied:
- No individual assessment outcome less than F+ against Level 6 criteria;
- No outcome associated with non-submission including marks of 0 for academic misconduct, late submission etc.
- A rounded award mark of 40+ assessed against Level 6 (Honours) marking criteria.
- Have achieved a pass standard in academic modules as appropriate.
- [b] The <u>award</u> shall be styled:

Professional Graduate Certificate in Education [Designation] and with recommendation for QTS.
