

Tuition Fee Expenditure can be categorised into 4 main areas:



KEY FACTS ABOUT STAFF COSTS

- £30 million was spent on staff costs
- 61% of the staff costs relate to academic staff to support SSR (Student Staff Ratio) of 1:14.9
- Over 75% of academic staff are qualified to doctoral level Liverpool Hope University is ranked 16th of all UK Universities for percentage of academic staff with doctorates.
- The University does not outsource any services (all services are provided in-house)





OTHER OPERATING EXPENDITURE




256 Students have benefitted from Scholarship Funds **222 Students** have benefitted from Student Support Funds
