There are several schemes that allow students access to other libraries.

<u>SCONUL Access</u> enables all postgraduates (including PGCE, MPhil and PhD students), as well as part-time undergraduates, to borrow material from other libraries. SCONUL Access allows full-time undergraduates reference user rights. In order to apply to join the SCONUL access scheme, you must not have any outstanding charges or any overdue loans on your account.

The University of Liverpool recently changed its access policy for Liverpool Hope University students and staff. All students and staff who wish to use either the Harold Cohen Library or Sydney Jones Library must now apply for a SCONUL Access membership via the <u>SCONUL</u> <u>Access website</u>.

You will then receive an acceptance email, which you can take to a University of Liverpool library and they will then process your application, this can take between 1 - 5 days. Please remember to take your Hope ID card for identification purposes. Full time undergraduate students will receive reference user rights, while postgraduates and part-time undergraduates may be able to borrow materials. - Complete the form (you may use Liverpool Hope's postcode L16 9JD and Building number 1 if you live beyond Liverpool City Council threshold).

Other local libraries

The Athenaeum

<u>The Athenaeum</u> is a subscription library located in Liverpool founded in 1800. The library has 60,000 items in stock and consists of a reading room, news-room, a Committee room containing rare items and the famous William Roscoe collection. The collections mainly cover history and literature.

To become a "Friend" of the Athenaeum library you need to complete an application form. The application needs to be sponsored by a tutor or head of department at Liverpool Hope University.

Membership is free, but each visit costs £10 (please contact the Athenaeum Library directly if you need to make several visits).
