




E-book platform accessibility support guide

Ebook Central - accessibility settings




Scroll down the [Library homepage](#) until you get to the **A to Z of Databases** list underneath the OneSearch textbox.



From the **A to Z of Databases** list click on **E** from the list and select **Ebook Central**.



Click on **Settings** from the toolbar on the **Ebook Central** homepage and then select **Profile**.



Scroll down until you reach **Accessibility Mode**. Click the **Enable Accessibility Mode** button and the **Use OpenDyslexic typeface** if liked. You must agree to **Proquest's privacy policy and terms of service** before clicking on **Save changes**.





Your **Profile** selections will be saved and will be available whenever you access an ebook from the **Ebook Central** platform using **OneSearch**.

Ebooks on EBSCO - accessibility options

Unlike Ebook Central, the **Ebooks on EBSCO** platform does not allow personalised settings, but it does offer other accessibility support.

If you click on the **View full text** link on a **OneSearch** ebook record and it goes to the **Ebooks on EBSCO** platform, many books offer a couple of on-screen viewing options.




EPUB full-text if available as an option is a good one to select as it automatically resizes the book to fit your screen. This format works well with screen readers as it's designed for accessibility and navigation.
