



Learning and Teaching Prize 2024

Context

The annual Liverpool Hope Excellence in Learning and Teaching Prize aims to recognise individual staff, teams, and/or subjects who can best demonstrate a commitment to enhancing the student experience through one or more of the underpinning principles of the Learning, Teaching and Assessment strategy, and to encourage the dissemination of good practice by sharing innovations with the wider University.

The winning individual, team, or subject will be awarded £1,000 to spend on learning and teaching resources or materials. The prize winner(s) will also be invited to share their good practice with the University community at a future Learning and Teaching Event.

The prize is open to all Liverpool Hope University staff.

Focus

The focus for this year's prize is improving student engagement and approaches taken to underpin student continuation between years of study. The project or intervention may be targeted at specific groups of students or the cohort as a whole. Submissions should clearly outline the aims and achieved outcomes alongside a description of the project/intervention. There **must** also be evidence of the impact on the students and their experience. Evidence from students of the impact on their experience should be included. (e.g. student feedback, course evaluations, external examiner comments, NSS, marks and continuation rates)

Selection Criteria

All entries should have the following characteristics:

- Originality.
- A demonstrated significant impact on student experience.
- Potential for widespread use within or across disciplines.

Submission

The submission deadline is Monday 9th December 2024. Please submit entries via the L&T Prize template (below) to learningandteaching@hope.ac.uk.

Winners are announced by the Vice Chancellor on Foundation Day and receive a monetary prize to be spent on Learning Resources as they see fit.
