EDUCATION LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT I: PERSPECTIVES ON LEADERSHIP

Duration: 4 months | Delivery: Online | Start date: October 2023



Recognising the challenges faced by those in leadership roles and the need to support the development of leadership competencies at all levels, this module explores leadership, with a specific focus on leadership within different education organisations. In particular, the module explores the nature of leadership and management through a number of different thematic 'lenses' and considers the role leaders play within improvement and change programmes.

Module Overview

- Leading and Managing: What is the difference and does it matter?
- Theories of leadership including: hierarchical, distributed, contingency, authentic, situational, servant transformational.
- Leadership Roles and Styles.
- Leadership in Practice.
- Leading in Challenging Times: The Education Landscape Comparative studies of leadership across cultures, and in a variety of educational institutions (schools, colleges, FE, HE, faith schools, work based learning settings).
- Understanding self and others: Emotional Intelligence, focusing on participants' own knowledge, skills, values and behaviours.
- Understanding organisational change and development.
- · Improvement tools and techniques.
- Impact of effective leadership on student outcomes and organisational health.
- MBTI profiling may be offered.



Delivery

The module will be delivered on a part-time basis through fully online learning including:

- Access to Liverpool Hopes Virtual Learning Environment
- Online seminars via Zoom
- Online discussion forums
- Access to Liverpool Hope University's Electronic Library
- Guided Reading
- Assessment support via email and zoom.

Assessment

Participants will be expected to complete a Case Study of 4500 words and 2x Forum Posts of 250 words each. Please note that this course can be accredited or non-accredited depending on individual needs and progression. If participants choose the accredited option they can gain 30 Masters level credits (upon completion of Module 1) or 60 Masters level credits (upon completion of the full Post Graduate Certificate).

Dates and Duration

Starts October 2023 and takes 4 months to complete.

Entry requirements

First Class or Upper Second Class Honours Degree in a relevant discipline (applications from participants who do not hold a 1st or 2:1 Honours Degree (or equivalent), but have appropriate professional experience will be considered).

Due to the leadership specialism the expectation of the applicant will be that they have gained some leadership experience within an education or care setting. Normally they will be engaged in a leadership role at the time of starting on the programme but aspirational leaders will also be considered if they have the support to engage with leadership practice within their setting.

International Entry Requirements

For students whose first language is not English there is a language requirement of IELTS 6.5 overall with 6.0 minimum of all components. In addition to this, we also accept a wide range of International Qualifications, for more information please visit: www.hope.ac.uk/englishlanguagerequirements.

Progression

Participants may undertake a further 30 Masters credit module 'Education Leadership & Management II: Working Effectively with Others' and gain a Postgraduate Certificate in Education Leadership & Management or may progress onto a full Masters.
