

Documents for your Short term study visa application – Non-visa nationals

You will need to have the originals of these documents with you and provide them to the Border Force Officer at the port of entry, to support your application to enter the UK as a short term student.

Passport

Your original valid passport must be submitted.

Evidence of your unconditional offer to study in the UK

The University will provide you with a letter, stating the title and duration of your intended study and the course fees.

Evidence of your qualifications

Your letter from the University will state any qualifications that were used to assess your suitability for the course. If the letter states any qualifications, you must provide original transcripts or certificates for qualifications. This may include English language certificates.

Evidence of your accommodation

If you have booked campus accommodation, this will also be included in the letter issued by the University. If not, you must provide other evidence that you have secured accommodation in the UK, even if this is temporary accommodation, such as a hotel while you look for somewhere to live.

Evidence of your finances

You will need to prove that you have enough money to live in the UK without working or relying on public funds. There is no specific required amount required, but you will need to show that you have enough money to pay your fees plus approximately £1000 per month (including accommodation costs).

Translations

If any of your documents are not in English, you will need to submit an official translation with them.

Immigration permission

If you are making your visa application from a country that you are not a national of, you will need to submit evidence of your permission to be in that country.

TB Test Result

You will need a TB certificate if you are from a country where you have to take the test before entry to the UK is permitted. [Please see here for more information.](#)
