The Online Historical Population Reports (OHPR) collection provides online access to the complete British population reports for Britain and Ireland from 1801 to 1937.

[Olive Active Paper Archive](#)

ActivePaper Archive is a collection of newspaper headlines from the Manchester Guardian, Daily News, News of the World and the Weekly Dispatch dating from 1851 to 1918. You can use a keyword search to find a resource or a particular date. It is a limited resource, as it has only a selected number of years but it can be useful for finding more local news articles.

[Local Image Collection](#)

The Manchester Local Image Collection is a unique photographic record of Manchester, its people, streets and buildings from a period stretching well over 100 years. Over 80,000 images of Manchester and the surrounding area are available to view online. The database contains pictures depicting executions and public reaction. One example is the Manchester Outrage, where Sergeant Charles Brett was killed in the Irish struggle for freedom from British rule, providing an insight into Irish nationalism.

[British Cartoon Archive](#)

The British Cartoon Archive allows users to search their full collection of British cartoons, comic strips, newspaper cuttings and artwork dating back to 1904. User can use a keyword search to find satirical depictions of crime and criminal culture, i.e. the portrayal of the incompetent policeman versus the intelligent criminal. Users can also search using a particular author or publishing date. The Archive has over a 140,000 pieces of cartoon artwork supported by a reference library of newspaper cuttings, books, catalogues and magazines.

[Ninetieth-Century Serials Edition](#)

The *Nineteenth-Century Serials Edition* is a free, online scholarly edition of six nineteenth-century periodicals and newspapers. The database provides newspapers accounts from 1806 to 1890 from a variety of different sources, giving a reflection of events in the 19th century.

[The National Library of Wales](#)

The site allows users to view issue of crime from a Welsh perspective, with the archive containing 7.6 million articles and 725,000 pages. Search can also be filtered on a regional basis so users can view how different parts of Wales dealt with crime. All newspaper sources are open access and no subscription is required.

[Columbia University Libraries](#)

This is an image database and indexing tool comprising some 13,000 documents (more than 30,000 page images) scanned chiefly from photocopies of original documents

[North Carolina Digital Collection](#)

The North Carolina Digital Collections contain over 90,000 historic and recent photographs, state government publications, manuscripts, and other resources on topics related to North Carolina. The Collections are free and full-text searchable, and bring together content from the State Archives of North Carolina and the State Library of North Carolina.

[HANSARD](#)

The HANSARD database is an online archive of debates that took place in the House of Parliament between 1803 and 2005. A user can use a keyword search to find a resource or they can search using the year. The database will show all the written Answers, written Statements and the transcripts of the debates that took place in the House of Commons. The site has been produced from digitised editions of Commons and Lords Hansard, the Official Report of debates in Parliament.
