



CULTURE

BUZZING WITH A CULTURE THAT APPEALS TO ALL AGES AND INTERESTS, LIVERPOOL WAS RECOGNISED IN 2008 AND APPOINTED THE EUROPEAN CAPITAL OF CULTURE. THE CITY HAS SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE, ESPECIALLY ITS 50,000 STUDENTS – THERE'S PLENTY FOR US TO DO!





MUSEUMS

There are four museums in the city and they're all free. The Museum of Liverpool tells the global story of Liverpool's people and heritage through interactive exhibitions. The Maritime Museum's exhibits relate to Liverpool's nautical heritage, including an interesting exhibition about the Titanic. while the International Slavery Museum is very emotional. but crucial if you want to learn about Britain's past and the British Empire. Last on the list is the World Museum, which has exhibitions that include an aguarium and insect cave.



There's a large China Town that has great restaurants, but also shops if you want to recreate your favourite Chinese food at home. I'd recommend going during Chinese New Year, as the celebrations and decorations are fantastic.









ART

Liverpool's art scene is extensive, with pop-up pieces appearing throughout the city all-year round. Liverpool's Biennial Festival, which runs for 11 weeks each year, includes exhibitions and performance art pieces from contemporary artists. There's something for everyone with the Walker Art Gallery, TATE Liverpool, The Bluecoat and FACT to choose from.





THEATRE

The city has lots of performances to offer through its seven theatres. Musical fans should visit the Empire Theatre for feelgood popular musicals, while the Playhouse and Everyman Theatres show everything from Shakespeare's classics, to plays by local writers such as Willy Russell. Both have tickets for £5 with a student ID card. The smaller Unity Theatre has a variety of shows and more experimental theatre, while the Epstein and Royal Court theatres are the place for comedies and pantomimes.

RIVER OF LIGHT

The River of Light festival happens every year during bonfire night celebrations, and is a spectacular firework show that can be seen from both sides of the Mersey. The visuals are accompanied by music and best of all, the incredible event is free. Be sure to wrap up warm with a scarf and gloves, as it's in November and being on the waterfront can get fairly cold!





CATHEDRALS

Liverpool is home to two cathedrals; Liverpool Cathedral and Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral, know as 'the Anglican one' and 'the Catholic one'. Both are free to roam around, as you take in the modern and gothic-inspired architecture.



SPREAD YOUR WINGS

Need to liven up your Instagram feed or update your profile picture? This is the spot. The street art by Paul Culture Artwork will give any Liver Bird their wings.

PARKS

There are lots of beautiful parks and gardens that are free to explore, bring a picnic in the summer, or a flask of hot soup or tea in the winter. Not far from the Hope Park campus is Calderstones Park, while next to Aigburth is the beautiful Festival Gardens with Chinese and Japanese-inspired gardens. Sefton Park is a huge green space with a Palm House, and across the road from the Creative Campus is Everton Park.







BEACHES

West Kirby beach in Wirral has views across to Wales and the Hilbre Islands, while Crosby beach is long and sandy with cast iron life-size sculptures of men - part of an art installation by Angel of the North artist Antony Gormley.

SPRING CITY

Spring City is Liverpool's first trampoline park situated just outside the city centre. As well as trampolines, Spring City has basketball lanes, a dodgeball court, tumble track and a jump bag. There's also a Student '90s Night on a Monday for £5, essentially a student party on trampolines with '90s music!

LIVERPOOL ESCAPE


CONCERT SQUARE

M&S BANK ARENA

Time to move on to the big guns! The M&S Bank Arena hosts the biggest names in world music and is used by many of the top musicians and artists of today's music scene. Keep an eye out for your favourite artists' name popping up on the bill of this venue, as you'll be sure to get yourself a ticket and get down there.





▼ THE CAVERN CLUB

This is one of the hottest tourist spots in Liverpool! Located in the city centre on Mathew Street - arquably one of the most famous streets in the world - the Cavern is known for its ties to the Beatles, who played at the original Cavern over 200 times throughout their early career. There are over 40 live acts on at the Cavern every week, from tribute bands to original artists. There are also many ticketed events on at the Cavern throughout the year that you can go to. If you are a budding performer yourself, there are opportunities to apply to play at the Cavern.



FESTIVAL SCENE

AFRICA OYÉ

The UK's largest free celebration of African music and culture takes place annually in Liverpool. Africa Oyé highlights the diverse range of cultures, foods, music and artists that hail from Africa. The festival has gone from strength-to-strength since launching in 1992, and now welcomes thousands of people to Sefton Park each year.

INTERNATIONAL MUSIC FESTIVAL (LIMF)

With eight events held across five days, LIMF 2016 saw more than 300 artists and 120,000 people turn out for a celebration of music. LIMF Summer Jam is the free element, where household names and up-and-coming acts perform. The 2019 line-up included Sigma, Ella Eyre, Sister Sledge, Maverick Sabre and Anton Powers

SOUND CITY



Known as the biggest independent festival in the UK, Sound City features some of music's most famous faces alongside upand-coming bands and emerging talent.

The three-day festival has run for 13 years and some of Hope's own home-grown talent has featured on stage. After winning the University's talent competition Fearless, student band The Left Backs were given the opportunity to perform at the renowned festival.

FUSION FESTIVAL

Located in Sefton Park, just a short drive from the city centre, Fusion Festival is the perfect event to round off your summer! Normally taking place on over the first weekend of September, Fusion Festival has been a key date for many local music fans. Some of the notable acts that have performed there over the years include Shawn Mendes, Take That, Years and Years, Jess Glynn and David Guetta to name a few. It is guaranteed to be a fun-filled weekend to spend with your friends catching the remainder of the summer sun. It's an event not to be missed!



LIVERPOOL IRISH FESTIVAL

The Liverpool Irish Festival is known for bridging the gap between Liverpool and Ireland through the arts. This festival links together performances, participation and education of Irish traditions, music, art, literature and theatre. The festival aims to celebrate the rich heritage shared by Liverpool and Ireland and is an event not to be missed! There are a wide variety of bands and headline acts over the week to suit any music fan.







PLACES TO SHOP

LIVERPOOL ONE

As one of the most popular shopping locations in Liverpool, Liverpool One has four districts; St Peters Lane, South John Street, Paradise Street and Hanover Street. Each district offers its own tasteful take on retail







ST JOHN'S

The shopping centre is right in the heart of the city and has over 100 shops. Popular high street brands and specialised stores selling items such as shampoos and hair protection products for African-Caribbean hair, wigs, extensions and relaxers, can be found at St John's, making it a cheaper place to shop compared to Liverpool One. It's also home to individual brands and some of the more student budget-friendly fashion boutiques.



BOLD STREET

Lonely Planet voted Bold Street one of the best streets in the country for shopping. With its mixture of independently owned cafes and shops and high street brands, Bold Street can and will keep you occupied for hours. Cafés such as LEAF offer a nice rest stop between shops. With the end of the street looking towards the historic church of St Luke - otherwise known as the Bombed out Church - this street is perfect for any occasion.









SMITHDOWN ROAD

Only a few minutes from the University's Hope Park Campus, Smithdown Road has a huge variety of shops catered towards students. Many restaurants and shops can be found along Smithdown Road, selling not only the standard amenities, but all sorts. From vinyl records to vegan food, you'll be surprised by just how much variety you can find along this one street!





EVERTON TWO & LIVERPOOL ONE

THE BEATLES STORE

If you're after something a bit different, the city has a store dedicated to its greatest musical export and one of the most influential bands of all time – The Beatles. Every inch of the The Beatles Store is covered in merchandise, with t-shirts draped across the ceiling and posters plastering the walls. If you're a music student or just a huge Beatles fan, this is the shop for you.





METQUARTER

Looking for places to shop, grab a coffee or maybe you just want to go to the cinema? Why not take a trip down to the MetQuarter where you can do all these things. Located only around the corner from Liverpool One, it's a convenient and popular choice that is sure not to disappoint.

FOOTBALL

Home to two of the Premier League's original members, Merseyside has the longest-running top-flight football derby in England. **Everton Football Club** and **Liverpool Football Club** have been members of the Premier League every season since it was founded in 1992, and share a friendly rivalry. With **Goodison Park** and **Anfield** not far from the city centre, football fans can get tickets to watch a game, or book on a tour of the stadiums to get a sneak-peak at the changing rooms and gawp at the huge trophies.

HORSE RACING

If you prefer a day at the races, the Grand National is held every year at Aintree Racecourse. The famous horse race has been a British sporting institution since 1839, and thousands of people go to the three-day festival each year.
