Our campuses

Hope Park

Liverpool Hope's largest campus, Hope Park, is a friendly educational village with places to live, work, study, eat and relax. It's situated in a leafy suburb of Liverpool, just four miles from the city centre. Hope Park offers all our students excellent facilities in beautiful surroundings.

We offer a free shuttle bus service between our three Liverpool-based campuses.

Meet at Our Place

Our Place is the focus for student social activity at Hope Park. It includes an American-style pizza restaurant, smoothie and coffee shop, and hosts live music and comedy nights. It also has places to relax with friends and play pool or video games.

Hope Park Sports



Hope Park Sports features state-of-the-art facilities, including:

- Sports hall with six courts and viewing gallery
- 3G pitches
- Squash courts
- Tennis courts
- Gym and fitness rooms
- Physiotherapy and Sports Rehabilitation Clinic
- Strength and conditioning suites

To ensure the sports facilities are easy for you to use, there are no monthly fees - **a single yearly registration fee of £25** is all that is required, and then the gym facilities, courts and fitness classes are all free for you to use!

Spotlight on our Health Sciences Building



Our Health Sciences Building features specialist laboratory spaces dedicated to nutrition, genomics, cell biology and psychology, along with laboratories and space for sport and exercise science. It also houses:

- A 25m sprint track with force meters and motion capture for biomechanical analysis.
- A phlebotics lab for blood sampling
- Dual-energy X-ray Absorptiometry (DEXA) scanner for assessing bone and muscle health
- Treadmills and BODPODs for physiological analysis
- Nutrition labs with food analysis and testing facilities
- Psychology labs which include motor control capture and vision and colour labs, as well as cognitive and neuro-behaviour suites.

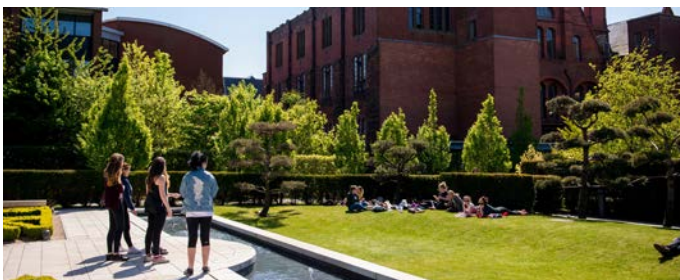

Creative Campus

Our Creative Campus is close to Liverpool city centre and is home to our School of Creative and Performing Arts. It's set within the tranquil Angel Field - a Renaissance-style garden that has won six design awards. Here, you can learn your craft in the inspirational setting of Grade II-listed buildings and state-of-the-art performance spaces.



The University has invested heavily in this campus, unveiling a new Arts Centre, Graphic Design Studio, Fabrication Lab and extensive student spaces.

The transformed spaces include:

- Three theatres
- Two dance studios
- Two black box performance spaces
- Music technology laboratory
- Recording studio
- Motion Picture Factory for film and TV studies
- Studios for painting, sculpture, wood, ceramics, metal and textiles.

Spotlight on

The Cornerstone Building

The Cornerstone Building has undergone an extensive renovation, with the ground floor transformed into an impressive social space, complete with a food court and breakout areas.

The Cornerstone Gallery - which hosts contemporary art exhibitions, student-led seminars and some of the best examples of current professional practice.



The Great Hall - a stunning example of open space suitable for a multitude of events, including student exhibitions and guest lectures.

Café 1846 - the hub of the Cornerstone, which features a large social space, food court and breakout areas.



Creative facilities - for the development of students' artwork, including studios, kilns, workshops and metalwork studios.

Aigburth Park

Aigburth Park is our residential campus, which is around three miles from the city centre and Hope Park. The halls are set in private landscaped gardens and there is a wealth of shops, banks, bars and restaurants, plus a library located nearby.



Liverpool's most famous park, Sefton Park, is also in the immediate vicinity. There are regular buses into the city centre and to Hope Park, plus St Michaels train station is close by.

Aigburth Park provides four blocks of purpose-built accommodation. All rooms are single occupation and include internet access.



Plas Caerdeon

Plas Caerdeon is the University's outdoor education centre in Snowdonia. The 80-bed centre offers a wide range of residential courses.

As part of your studies, you may have the opportunity to visit this beautiful woodland setting on field trips, environmental and biological research excursions or art workshops. The Centre also delivers team building courses, including mountaineering, kayaking and other outdoor activities.

With two international airports on the doorstep and just a two-hour train journey from central London, Liverpool is one of the UK's best-connected cities.

Hope Park

The 532 rooms available are reserved for first year undergraduates and include both en-suite and rooms with shared facilities. The en-suite halls at Hope Park provide you with a single bed, double wardrobe, study area, chair, drawers and shelves, plus an en-suite shower room and toilet. We also have six traditional halls of residence with shared bathrooms, providing an informal and friendly environment for students who enjoy socialising and making friends.



Creative Campus

Our accommodation is situated just outside the city centre and is convenient for all amenities associated with city living, while being away from the main hustle and bustle. The modern, purpose-built hall is situated in Angel Field, a beautiful landscaped garden.

Aigburth Park

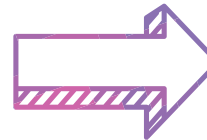
Student support and well-being

Study overseas

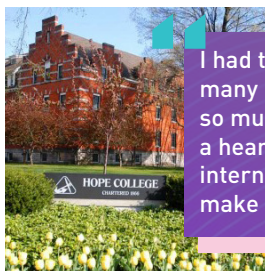

Study at Hope

Our degrees

The following section details the different undergraduate degree courses that can be studied at Hope, and prospective career paths. More detailed information for each of these can be found on our website.



We offer a wide range of degrees, from Undergraduate level to Postgraduate Taught Masters and Postgraduate Research degrees, as well as a number of Professional Learning and Development (PLD) courses.

Single Honours Degrees

If you choose to study a Single Honours degree, you are choosing to study one main subject area. Single Honours degrees are a good choice if you have a particular subject area you want to study in more depth.

Combined Honours Degrees

If you choose to study a Combined Honours degree, you are choosing to study two subject areas equally. Combined Honours degrees are a good choice if you are interested in more than one subject area.

DID YOU KNOW?

We offer more than 1,000 course combinations.

Placement Years

Most of our degrees can be studied with a year spent in industry. This placement year is additional to your degree and gives you the opportunity to gain valuable workplace experience before you graduate.




Part-Time Study

Most of Liverpool Hope's Undergraduate programmes are available for study on a part-time basis, with the exception of the degree in Social Work and the Primary Education with Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) course.

Part-time study normally doubles an Honours degree programme to twice its full-time duration i.e. six years.

Degrees with Foundation Year

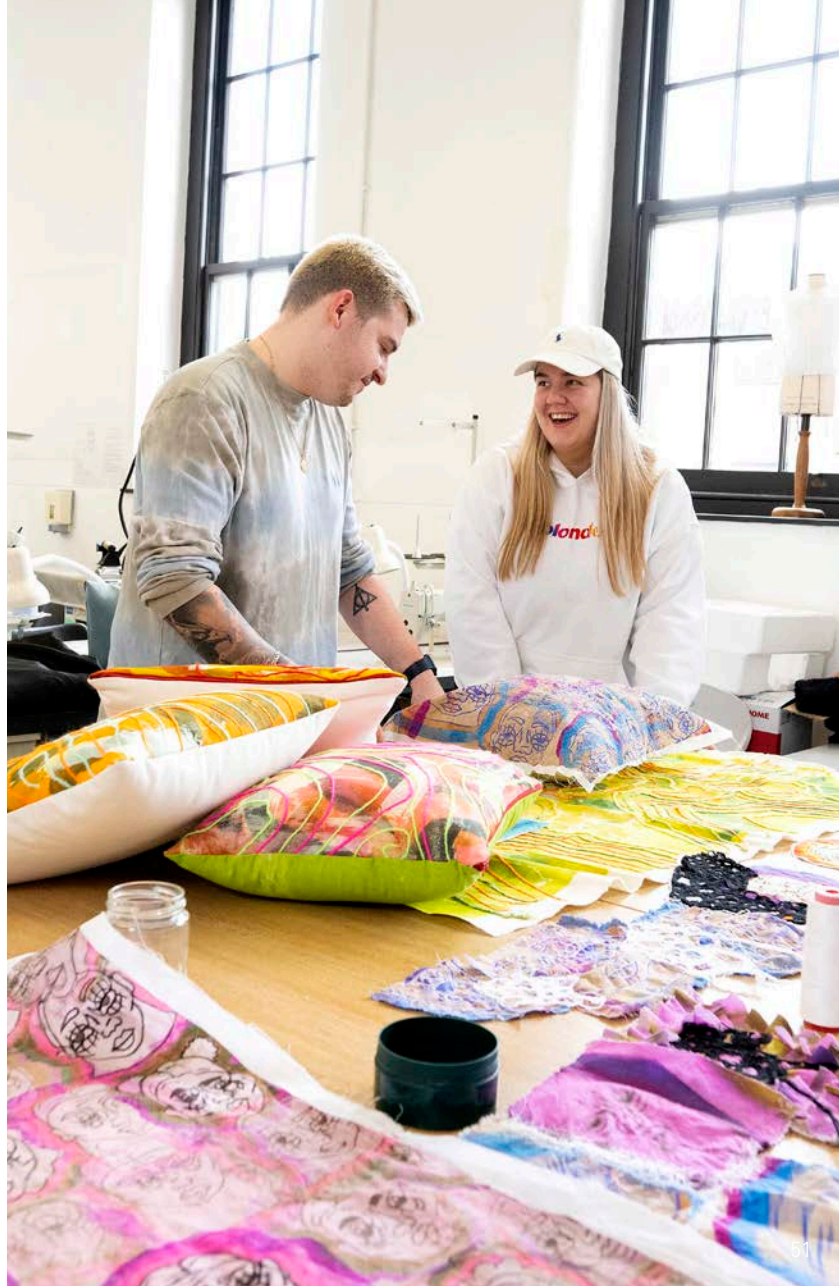
The Degree with Foundation Year is a great opportunity if you have the ability and enthusiasm to study for a degree, but do not yet have the qualifications required to enter directly onto a degree programme. Successful completion of the Foundation Year will enable you to progress into the first year (Level C) of your chosen honours degree. If you are a full time UK student, you will qualify for student financial support for the full duration of your course (subject to relevant criteria).

A significant part of our Degree with Foundation Year focuses upon core skills such as academic writing for Higher Education, becoming an independent learner, structuring academic work, critical thinking, time management and note taking. The Foundation Year is a full-time course and forms the first year of a four-year degree. You will be a student of the University and have access to all the standard support systems and resources that any degree student would be able to access.

All courses can be undertaken with a Foundation Year, with the exception of: Sports Rehabilitation, Art & Design History, Primary Education (5-11), Early Education Primary (3-7), Nutrition and Social Work.

Applying to Liverpool Hope

For all full-time higher education courses at universities and colleges in the UK, students must apply online at: www.ucas.com

There are three types of applicant:

1

Students studying at a school or college registered with UCAS

2

Independent applicants in the UK who are not at school or college

3

International applicants outside the UK (EU and worldwide).

For all applicants, there are full instructions at www.ucas.com to make it as easy as possible for you to complete your online application.

Important information

The UCAS number and abbreviated name for Liverpool Hope University is L46 and LHOPE. These must be entered in the appropriate boxes of the UCAS form, along with course codes for your chosen programme(s), which can be found on the UCAS website.

Applications should be submitted by the UCAS deadline. After this date, applications can still be made, but your chosen course may not be available.

Admissions policy and entry requirements

Admissions policy

It is Liverpool Hope University's policy to admit those students who demonstrate they have the academic ability and personal motivation to succeed in their chosen programme of study. We actively encourage applications from students who are looking to be intellectually stretched, stimulated and challenged in their studies.

We welcome those who will add energy and bring breadth of experience and vitality to the University community. The University Recruitment and Admissions Policy is available on our website.



Entry requirements

At the time of going to print, the standard offer level is between BBB-BBC from A levels or DDM-DMM from BTEC, or 120-112 UCAS tariff points. For a full list of accepted qualifications and offer levels, please refer to our subject entry profiles, which are available from the UCAS website: www.ucas.com

Additionally, applicants will be required to meet any further subject-specific entry requirements. You can quickly check your course in the previous section and find further information at: www.hope.ac.uk/studyathope/coursefinder. Degrees such as Dance and Social Work require you to attend an interview or audition before an offer can be made.

Specific information that we will send to you when we make you an offer will include details of the course content, delivery and assessment methods, the tuition fee we will charge you and any additional costs.

The University reserves the right to increase Home and EU Undergraduate and PGCE tuition fees for future years of study in line with any inflationary or other increase authorised by the Secretary of State.

We will also send details of how you can access the regulations governing your degree and its structure, including how you will progress from year to year, information on examinations and

coursework, details of complaints and appeals procedures, details of disciplinary procedures, the full terms and conditions, your responsibility to pay all tuition fees on time and rules relating to refunds, rules and regulations relating to use of University IT Services and the Library. When you register as a student at the University, you will agree to abide by these rules, regulations, codes and other policies and procedures, the details of which will have been sent to you with your offer letter and will be highlighted again at registration.

You will need to meet any conditions attached to your offer in order to register as a student.

Right to cancel

You may have a statutory right to cancel your contract with the University within 14 days of accepting your place. More details about your right to cancel will be provided in your offer letter.

Use of your data

The University is registered as a data controller with the Information Commissioner's Office. We will hold and process your personal data, including some sensitive personal data in accordance with our Data Protection Policy and fair processing notice, which can be found on our website.
