Performance Scholarships

General Information

Liverpool Hope University is pleased to announce the continuation of our Performance Scholarship scheme in 2024/25 for Dance, Drama, Music or Sport for new students who have a portfolio of public performances or have performed at national level. These awards are intended to spot and support talent and potential. Each scholarship will be worth £3,000 over the period of study and will be awarded to full-time, home, fee-paying undergraduates who can demonstrate an exceptional level of excellence in Dance, Drama, Music or Sport.

These scholarships will be awarded by a committee made up of:

- Dr Penny Haughan (chair)
- Three other members of the Student Finance Committee (one to be either the SU President or Vice President)
- Where appropriate, a senior member of staff with experience in arts and music.
- Where appropriate, a senior member of staff with experience in sport.

The committee will meet to consider all applications in November and therefore the closing date for applications will be 31st October 2024.

The committee's decision will be final and letters will be sent to applicants after the panel meeting to either confirm the award or to explain why the application has been declined. As these are discretionary awards, appeals will be limited and would only be allowed on the grounds of procedural error in the awarding of the Performance scholarship. No appeals will be allowed against the value of the award.

Appeals would be considered by a sub-committee of the Bursaries and Scholarships Committee made up of the Registrar (Chair) and other members of the Bursaries and Scholarships Committee not involved in the initial consideration of the application.

Scholars will be expected to act as ambassadors and role models for the University in terms of their participation in sporting, musical or artistic activities. They will also be expected to assist in promoting the sporting, artistic and musical profile of the University.

Applying for a Performance Scholarship for Dance, Drama, Music or Sport

To apply for this scholarship, you must complete in full the Performance Scholarship application form ensuring that all the sections have been completed. You should include a personal statement of not more than 1,000 words explaining why you should be awarded this scholarship and a supporting statement from a suitably qualified person – for example a coach/teacher or a governing body. Appropriate supporting documentary evidence demonstrating the level of achievement reached must be provided to support any applications as these awards are limited and discretionary.

Successful applicants will normally be expected to contribute to University life whilst at Hope and may be called upon to support at least one of the following University activities.

- Assist in promoting Liverpool Hope University as a location for sports, music, drama or performing arts excellence and a provider of support services for such students
- Support the promotion of the sporting, musical, dramatic or performing arts profile of Liverpool Hope University including appearance in photographs, information for articles and press releases and other pertinent promotional activities
- To act as a role model for others seeking to improve their competence at what ever level.

In order to receive the award in subsequent years the scholar must:

- Have passed their subject(s) and have no record of academic misconduct
- Have abided by the codes of conduct outlined in the Student's guide
- Have an acceptable level of attendance
- Have no outstanding debt to the University

Payment schedule

Year 2 £1,000 payable in October 2025, February 2026 and July 2026

Year 3 £1,000 payable in October 2026, February 2027 and July 2027
